Minutes of the Meeting of Freckenham Parish Council on Monday 16th November 2020 at 7.30 pm held remotely

Cllr Wheeler welcomed everyone to the meeting.

County Councillor Busuttil reported on local projects including Sunnica, the housing development west of Mildenhall, the Hub and the replacement of the Mallards bridge.

Cllr Bustill also reported that he would be retiring in May 2021 and would not seek re-election.

District Councillor Harvey reported on various items including Sunnica, locality grants, county lines, local plan and rough sleepers in the area. He stated rough sleepers should not be approached but they can be reported at www.streetlink.org.uk.

It was reported that West Suffolk Council have issued a notice of vacancy which has been published accordingly. West Suffolk Council will confirm if the Parish Council can co-opt after the 17th November, which is 14days after the notice of vacancy was issued.

It was reported the plan was on schedule, with the intentions to be completed next year. A recent drop-in event held in the village hall was not attended as well as had been hoped.

Cllr Harvey thanked Cllr Douch on behalf of Worlington Parish Council for his help in providing contact details with regard to setting up a Neighbourhood plan.

8.4 Update on Sunnica Proposal

Cllr Douch gave the following report:

'We are part-way through the Statutory Consultation period, which has been extended to end on the 18^{th} December 2020 not the 2^{nd} December 2020.

The Parish Council delivered a villager survey to every household during October 2020 asking the question "Now you have seen the details of the scheme in the current Sunnica Statutory Consultation, are you in favour of the scheme?" to which 96% of respondents replied "No/Against" and the remainder "No view". There were no responses in favour of the scheme.

The Parish Council wrote a letter to Sunnica complaining about various aspects of the consultation, including problems with the booklet (e.g. maps too small and out of scale) lack of advertising and the format of the webinars. The complaint letter and the reply letter from Sunnica are available on the Parish Council website.

In their letter, Sunnica indicated they don't accept the Parish Council's criticisms of the consultation, but were happy to provide a banner for display in the village. The banner was provided at the end of October and fixed to the village hall gates on the 3^{rd} November with the kind agreement of the village hall trustees.

Sunnica has provided a printed copy of the Preliminary Environmental Impact Report (PEIR), which is with Cllr Douch and is available for loan to residents, providing they agree to guidance from SALC on usage to ensure they are Covid-19 safe. This document is also available from the Downloads section of the Sunnica website. Please note only the main chapters are included in the printed copy, the Appendices are not included. If parishioners wish to view this then they can contact any councillor or the clerk for details.

Sunnica have confirmed that large print brochures, maps and photomontages are available by calling their freephone number 0808 168 7925.

The Sunnica sub-group has continued to meet every two weeks during the consultation using Zoom. We would like to thank everyone, Councillors and residents, who are taking part. As part of their research for the Parish Council's consultation response, the sub-group produced an information article "What do you know about the Sunnica proposal?" for the Winter edition of the Parish Pump. The sub-group is currently working on the consultation response, and will review a draft at the next meeting on the 25th November. The sub-group intends to publish the response on the Parish Council website as soon as it is complete, and has set a target date of 2nd December (the original consultation closing date).

The Parish Council's Sunnica awareness stall with A2 laminated maps of the scheme was present outside the Freckenham Farmers Market in September and October. The intent of the stall is to encourage people to respond to the consultation, and instructions are shown on the stall. Visitors to the stall were interested to see the maps in large scale, and asked question about the scheme.

On Saturday the 12th November Worlington Parish Council hosted a Zoom meeting for residents to ask questions about the scheme, with Cllr Harvey assisting with information where he could.

The Parish Council intend to run a similar meeting for Freckenham on Saturday 28th November at 4pm, hosted by the Parish Council, with Cllr Harvey attending.'

Cllr Harvey suggested that the survey results are included in the Parish Council's official response.

Cllr Harvey reported that MP Matt Hancock is hosting a conversation on Sunnica via Zoom on Friday 20th November at 1pm and invites will be sent out shortly. He advises any questions should be submitted in advance.

11/20/09 Recreation Ground and other assets:

9.1 Playground/Recreation Ground Report

Cllr Cornell reported that the volunteer who had been carrying out the maintenance and killing of weeds on the footpath with other work in and around the recreation ground together with the flower bed on The Street, can no

longer continue to do so. Cllr Cornell expressed her thanks to the volunteer for the hard work carried out over many years.

Cllr Cornell stated her and her family would carry out this work until a suitable replacement is found.

9.2 Update on grass cutting

Cllr Cornell reported the grass was continuing to be cut when the weather allowed.

9.3 Any other matters

Cllr Cornell reported that some repair work needed to be carried out including treatment of timber at the park, and this would now be carried out in Spring 2021.

Cllr Wheeler reported that a tree by the flower bed in The Street had grown into the power cables situated above which had been reported to UKPN, and that this should be made safe soon.

11/20/10 Highways Inspection

Cllr Wheeler reported that he is awaiting a response from Suffolk County Council in regards to a visit from Guy Smith at SCC to look at the Highways issues in Freckenham, which he has been requesting for a long while as the previous engineer responsible had not been responding for some considerable time.

The Quiet Lanes scheme which Worlington are considering for Golf Links Road was discussed as it may be suitable for some lanes in Freckenham. The scheme makes quiet lanes safer for pedestrians and cyclists.

11/20/11 SALC, to confirm the date of the next local area

The date of the next meeting was confirmed as Tuesday 17th November at 7:00pm

The date of the next meeting is planned for either 17th or 24th March 2021.

11/20/13 Shores Charity

Cllr Douch reported that two quotes had been received to provide the allotments with a water bore hole with a hand pump; £1,400 plus VAT and £7,645 plus VAT.

It was proposed and agreed that the Parish Council would fund this project along with locality funds available from Suffolk County Council and West Suffolk Council.

It was agreed that the clerk would complete a West Suffolk fund form and look into whether or not the Parish Council can reclaim input VAT on the total cost. (JC)

14.3 Clerk to update on bank balances held

The clerk reported £2,097 was held in the current account and £23,644 in the deposit account.

14.4 Clerk to present the first draft of the 2021/2022 budget for consideration by this Council.

The budget was presented to all members.

The budget showed total expenditure of £15,055, which is to be funded by the proposed precept of £13,400 and £1,655 from other expected income.

The proposed precept would result in an increase to band D council tax payers of 0.1%. The weekly payment would be £1.90 the same as the current year.

Cllr Wheeler suggested increasing totalling expenditure by £400 to £15,455, which would increase the precept to £13,800 resulting in an increase of 3.09% to band D council tax payers. This would result in the weekly payment being increased to £1.96.

A final proposed budget would be presented at the next meeting.
